





ALIPH, Europa Nostra, Global Heritage Fund have joined together to host Ukrainian heritage fellows.


ALIPH has supported a Ukrainian 3-D scanning project for historical architecture in Lviv.

Scientific organizations in Europe and the U.S, are cataloging and documenting scientific collections.


Various library organizations are supporting the scanning and digitization of rare books, articles and reports.
